HOW TO GET THERE?

ACCESS BY PLANE

Stockholm Arlanda Airport (ARN): The airport is 65km from the base, which is a 55-minute journey by car/shuttle ride. There are regular flights from all major cities with all major carriers, please check the schedule on the [airport website](#).

TRANSFERS FROM THE AIRPORT TO OUR BASE

If you need an organized transfer from the airport, please contact our base manager. Major car rental companies operate from the airport, please refer to airport website for info, working hours and contacts. Taxis are regularly available in front of the airport buildings.

ACCESS BY ROAD

Follow exit signs towards Stockholm/E4/E18. Stay on E4 towards Stockholm. Bypass Stockholm C by staying on E4/E20. Take exit 155 toward 75/222. Continue on 75 and then stay left on 222. At the interchange Trafikplats Skvaltán, use the right lane to follow signs for Saltsjöbaden/Fisksätra. Continue onto Saltsjöbadsleden and then on Stockholmsvägen. In Neglinge, turn left toward Skogsövägen. Sune Carlsson Boatyard is located on the right.

ACCESS BY BUS

Arlanda Express is a fast train service that connects the airport and Stockholm C. There are two stations, Arlanda North (Terminal 5) and Arlanda South (Terminal 2,3 and 4). The trip to Stockholm C takes 20 minutes.

Flygbussarna is a bus service that operates between Arlanda Airport and Stockholm C. The service takes 45 minutes. From Stockholm Central Station it is possible to take the Tunnelbana (metro train) to Slussen where Bus 25B connects Slussen and Henriksdal Station. From Henriksdal take the Saltsjöbanan (local train) to Neglinge Station (23 minutes). From there walk towards Skogsövägen 22 and enter Sune Carlsson Boatyard to the right.

AREA GUIDE

LOCAL AREA INTRODUCTION

The Swedish capital city of Stockholm is spread across 14 islands in the Baltic Sea. Based on a medieval street layout, Stockholm has retained its charm and old-style architecture with an attractive old town.

The Stockholm archipelago holds 30,000 islands, islets and rocks and is the second largest in the world. Sail through peaceful coves or hit the open sea for high waves and an adventurous sailing experience. The islands are home to both new communities and ancient villages bursting with Nordic culture.

TOP THINGS TO DO IN TAHITI:

1. Saltsjöbaden ("the Salt Sea baths"): A relatively small town just 20 minutes drive from Stockholm city. It lies on the shores of Baggensfjärden and is surrounded by forest to the west. During the summer months it springs to life.
2. Holmen Kök & Bar: On a sunny day this is a very popular spot for eating and drinking as it's on the edge of the harbor facing the afternoon and evening sun. A family friendly beach that offers a restaurant on the deck overlooking the beach adjoins the famous bathing baths.
3. Erstaviksbadet: It has both a small and larger sandy beach that is a 20-minute walk from Erstavik train station (Solsiden line). Here you'll also find a rocky shoreline to enjoy sunbathing and swimming.
4. Lake Lundsjön: For those that fancy hiking, a path travels around the lake Lundsjön all the way to the golf course close to Saltsjöbaden Centrum.

INTERNET

Cell phones can work depending on zones but don't forget the roaming fees! There is Internet access via cafes and Wi-Fi hotspots, but you may need to pay. Our yachts are fitted with Wi-Fi.

SAILING CONDITIONS

SAILING AREA

Our base at Sune Carlsson Boatyard in Saltsjöbaden is a great place to start your sailing vacation. Saltsjöbaden is a fantastic gateway to the archipelago. After casting off you'll soon enter Ingaröfjärden and the first islands of the inner archipelago.

You may sail and explore the waters of Stockholm Archipelago extending to Arholma in the north. Turning south you may visit St Anna's Archipelago and as far as the town of Gryt.

Sailing to the east, through the last islands of the archipelago, you may enter the open water of the Baltic Sea. Please note that easterly limitations apply.

You may also sail inland to the west of Stockholm after passing through the locks in the city where you can visit the large Lake of Mälaren.

WEATHER

For warm weather and sunshine, the best time to visit Stockholm is between May and September.

TEMPERATURE

In spring, particularly in May, there is a combination of mild and colder weather days. Summer, from June to August, is a mild season with highs around 68/73 °F and very long days. This season is generally pleasant but can see rain. June is a bit cooler than July, but it has the longest days of the year.

From around May 15 to July 29, the white nights occur, when it is not completely dark even at midnight. However, sometimes at night it can be very cool, or even cold, since the temperature can drop below 50 °F. It's always good to bring some warm clothes, like a jacket or sweater for the evening.

The sea temperatures around Stockholm are generally cool, reaching 59 °F in July and 61 °F in August.

WIND SYSTEMS

The wind is most often from the south spring through to fall and is generally quite calm. In fall, the average wind moves to the west and increases in strength.
