## HOW TO GET THERE?

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### ACCESS BY PLANE

Palma de Mallorca Airport (PMI): The airport is 10km from the marina, which is a 13-minute journey by car/shuttle. Fly via Barcelona or Madrid, as well as other European countries, with most major airlines. There are more flights during high season. Please check the schedule on the [airport website](#).

### TRANSFERS FROM THE AIRPORT TO OUR BASE

Major car rental companies operate from the airport; please refer to the airport website for info, working hours and contacts. Taxis are regularly available in front of the airport buildings.

### CAR PARK

You can find paid-for street and [underground](#) parking nearby.

Since the avenue is under construction, free parking is currently not available in the surrounding area, along Avda. de Gabriel Roca, Paseo Marítimo.

### ACCESS BY ROAD

From Palma de Mallorca Airport, head east on Carretera de l'Aeroport towards Disseminat Aeropuerto son Sant Joan for 350m. Take a slight left towards Disseminat Aeropuerto Son Sant Joan, and carry on for 500m.

Take a slight left onto Carretera de l'Aeroport/Disseminat Aeropuerto son Sant Joan and continue following Carretera de l'Aeroport for 800 m.

Keep right at the fork, follow the signs for Palma and turn onto Ma-19 for 5km. Keep left to continue on Autopista de Llevant , then Av. De Gabriel Roca and Ma-19. Continue to follow Av. De Gabriel Roca till you will see the marina at number 4.

## ACCESS BY BUS

From the airport, take the bus number A1 Es Baluard for 30 min (stop 547). From Es Baluard (Museum of modern and contemporary art) just cross the road and walk 700 mts to your right side, along the Paseo Marítimo.

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### LOCAL AREA INTRODUCTION

Sailing the Balearic Islands gives you a vacation full of warm, sunny days, wonderful sandy beaches, fantastic sailing, dramatic scenery, charming ports and world-class nightlife.

Off the coast of eastern Spain, the Balearic Islands' archipelago is perfect for water sports fans, nature lovers and those seeking to relax on the beach while soaking up the sun.

The island of Mallorca has a rich history stretching back to the ancient civilizations of Greece and Phoenicia thousands of years ago. The region is a popular yacht charter vacation spot thanks to its premier cruising ground.

## **INTERNET**

Generally, the Wi-Fi in most cities and towns in Palma de Mallorca and the Balearics is good. You'll find plenty of Wi-Fi hotspots at bars, restaurants, hotels and in the marina. Wi-Fi is on board.

## **ENVIRONMENT**

- Respect your surroundings and leave only footprints in the sand
- Only use the engine or genset when needed (fill up your tanks for the water maker at the docks when you can)
- Recycle your garbage in the correct containers at the marina
- Respect regulations around marine reserves and private islands where disembarking is not permitted

## **WEATHER**

The best time to visit Mallorca is between March to October, although the region has mild season weather all-year round. With 300 sunny days, Mallorca is known for its pleasant climate. The rainy season tends to be between October and December.

The average temperature in Mallorca in summer is about 86°F. The sea temperature in Mallorca in summer is about 79°F.

## **TEMPERATURE**

Climate in Mallorca:

- Summer high: The August high is around 86°F
- Winter low: The January low is 46°F



## WIND SYSTEMS

The sailing conditions in Mallorca include the Levant, which is an easterly wind that blows in the western Mediterranean and gives great sailing conditions. The region's consistent winds are one of the reasons why sailors love Mallorca.

Sailing is more challenging October to April with the risk of stronger winds. Meanwhile the sirocco, a southerly breeze in spring, and the mistral, a north-westerly in autumn, are tempered by the Gulf of Lion and bring heavy seas.

## WHAT TO PACK

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- Soft luggage that you can fold away or roll up - hard suitcases are hard to fit in your cabin and there is nowhere to store them onboard
- Reef-friendly sunblock and sun cream
- Dry bags or zip lock bags to protect your money, cameras and mobiles
- Seasickness bands and tablets are good for novice sailors
- Earplugs and eyeshades are great for light sleepers
- Keep clothing light and remember you will be around water a lot! Don't forget several swimsuits, hat, sunglasses and an extra beach towel (even though towels are provided)
- When it comes to shoes, you're likely to be barefoot onboard so pack just one pair for going ashore and some water shoes for reefs
- Leave expensive jewelry, make-up and hair straighteners behind – it's time to relax!
