Boarding time is 05:00pm.

YACHT BRIEFING

The chart and technical briefing take approximately one hour. All briefings are conducted on the chartered yacht and will take 40-90 minutes, depending on yacht size and crew experience

The team will give a detailed walk-through of your yacht's technical equipment, information about safe and accurate navigation, including the yacht's navigational instruments, as well as mooring, anchorage and itinerary help. The safety briefing introduces the safety equipment and your yacht's general inventory.

DISEMBARKATION TIME

All boats have to return to base on no later than 5pm on the last evening of charter and disembarkation is at 9am the following morning.

To assist in making checkout as smooth as possible, we ask that you arrive back at the base the evening before disembarkation. The team will inspect your yacht's equipment and a general visual check of its interior and exterior. A diver/rov will check its hull, keel, rudder(s) propeller(s) and /or bow thruster. General inspection will take approximately one hour.

CAR PARKING

Possible to park at the base.

BAGGAGE

Please only take soft bags and not suitcases, as they would be too cumbersome onboard.

HOW TO GET THERE?

ACCESS BY PLANE

Stavanger Airport (SVG): The airport is 30km from the base, which is a 35-minute journey by car/shuttle ride. Fly via major European cities, please check the schedule on the [airport website](#).

Haugesund Airport (HAU): The airport is 63km from the base, which is a 1 hour and 35-minute journey by car/shuttle ride. Fly via major European cities, please check the schedule on the [airport website](#).

TRANSFERS FROM THE AIRPORT TO OUR BASE

If you need organized transfer from the airport, please contact our base manager. Major car rental companies operate from the airport, please refer to airport website for info, working hours and contacts. Taxis are regularly available in front of the airport buildings.

ACCESS BY ROAD

From Stavanger Airport

From airport drive towards Nordsjøvegen, and at the roundabout take second exit on to Flyplassvegen/RV509. Keep left and continue to Tanangervegen/Rv509. After about 10 minutes take second exit on to Kvernevikveien and follow the road for 3 km. Turn left to Kyrkjeveien, first exit in the roundabout on to Goavegen and turn right on to Randabergveien. At the roundabout take the third exit on to Mekjarvikveien/E39. Follow E39 through the tunnel for about 10 km. Turn right on to Åmøyveien. After 3 km take the third exit on to Båsen veien, and the office will be there.

From Haugesund Airport

Take Helganesvegen to the roundabout. Turn right on to Karmøyvegen/Fv47. Follow Fv47 until the roundabout. Turn left on to Karmøytunnelen. In Karmøytunnelen take first exit in the roundabout. After the tunnel take E39 towards Mortavika/Stavanger. Take the ferry Arsvågen-Mortavika. Continue on E39 for about 15 km. Then turn left on to Åmøyveien. After 3 km take the third exit on to Båsen veien, and the office will be there.

AREA GUIDE

LOCAL AREA INTRODUCTION

Sail Norway from our base in the Stavanger and Ryfylke region to discover a wonderful and exotic sailing area that you'll be hard to replicate anywhere else. Norway's long, varied coastline has an impressive landscape with steep mountains, deep fjords and small islands, which offer an idyllic sailing vacation destination.

If you love city life, explore Stavanger, the largest city in the region and known for its strong cultural identity and history. It has a long tradition in the shipping and fishing industry, known for its canned sardines between the early 1800s up to the 1970s.

Stavanger's natural resources and oil industry means it is an international city with acclaimed restaurants. Dine on fresh seafood, lamb, vegetables and fruit from local producers and you may even be able to experience wild edibles and raw food. If you are sailing in July, check out Gladmat, the largest food festival in the Nordic countries.

For sailing Norway, you will need a sailing license that is recognized by the local port authorities, or you can hire a skipper.

TOP THINGS TO DO IN STAVANGER:

1. Hike to the Pulpit Rock (Preikestolen)

The **hike to the Pulpit Rock** is one of our favorite things to do on a Stavanger yacht charter. You can take one of the daily buses from Jørpeland to the bottom of the Pulpit rock trail. The hike takes 2 hours each way and the route is well marked. Get up early and head there for sunrise for a spectacular view. Don't forget your hiking shoes.

2. Stroll Old Stavanger

Head ashore and walk the old city with its wooden whitewashed houses that line the cobbled streets.

3. Visit the Kvitsøy islands

A visit to this idyllic island out in the open sea gives you a feeling of tranquility and closeness to nature. It is surrounded by the outer parts of Boknafjorden; to the north are Karmøy and Bokn, and to the east Rennesøy and Randaberg. Kvitsøy consists of as many as 167 islands, and have just over 500 inhabitants or kvitsøybu as they are also called. The islands are made up of transformed volcanic rocks that provide a small rocky archipelago landscape.

4. Sail Lysefjord

Embrace the remoteness of this impressive fjord where the goats manage to climb steep slopes down to the water's edge. Enjoy stunning rock formations and waterfalls as you sail the Norwegian waters. Vagabond's Cave is a highlight.

5. Dine at Skagenkaaien

Soak up the Nordic atmosphere in this historic square full of bars, restaurants and outdoor clothing shops. From local dishes to smart Asian Fusion, there will be a restaurant for everyone here.

INTERNET

There is Wi-Fi available in our marina some guest marinas and mobile 4G GSM networks have very good coverage in the region, also at sea. Cell phones can work depending on zones but don't forget the roaming fees!

ENVIRONMENT

- Only use the engine or genset when needed (fill up your tanks for the water maker at the docks when you can)
- Recycle your garbage in the correct containers at the marina
- Respect regulations around marine reserves and private islands where disembarking is not permitted

SAILING CONDITIONS

SAILING AREA

Our base at Aamoy Marina in Vestre Aamoy is a great place to start your Norwegian sailing vacation. Plan your charter around beautiful inhabited islands, such as Sjernerøyane, Kvitsøy, Utsira and Røvær, as well as the awe-striking fjords of Lysefjorden, Jøsenfjorden and Erfjorden.

Within this sailing region there are many sheltered places to anchor, either in marinas, where you can get shore power and stock up on groceries, or you can anchor for free in one of the plentiful quiet, natural coves or specially made piers around the islands.

If you love the great outdoors, you can combine your sailing vacation with a mountain hike. You can attempt a serious challenge with a 900-meter high mountain in the fjords, or something more relaxing with a 200m peak on one of the islands. There are several exciting attractions in the area, such as Pulpit Rock (Preikestolen), Kjerag and Lysefjord.

You need to be aware of underwater rocks and shallow areas, even though most of the hazards are well marked. Norway uses the international IALA Region A standard as the aid for navigation at sea. In Norway there are many iron poles (stake, perch) marking shallow waters or rocks. Many have a pointer on the top that points to the right track and deeper waters. Check your map or plotter for information before passing an iron pole.

WEATHER

The weather in the Stavanger and Ryfylke region is typically cool with partly cloudy summers.

The best time to visit Norway is between June and September when the weather is warmer, reaching a high of 64°F. April, May and June are the driest months

WIND SYSTEMS

Sailing conditions in the south west coast of Norway offers plenty of opportunities for sheltered anchorages. Most of the time you can stay inside the islands in relatively calm seas. Only a few passages takes you out in the open sea. The wind can be strong, up to 20 to 25 knots, especially in the afternoon. Most of the time, the wind is between 10 to 20 knots, perfect for sailing.
